## Algebra I – Sample Subject Exam Questions

1. Solve for x:

$$\frac{2x-5}{3}+4=\frac{x+7}{2}$$

Walk through your steps clearly and check your solution.

2. Factor completely:

$$2x^2 - 7x - 4$$

Explain your method (factoring by grouping, trial and error, etc.).

3. Graph the following linear inequality:

$$y > -\frac{1}{2}x + 3$$

Describe the boundary line, shading, and test point. What real-world scenario might this model?

- 4. A company makes a profit of \$4 per item after paying a fixed monthly cost of \$600. Write an equation to model this situation, then determine how many items they must sell to break even.
- 5. Solve the system of equations using substitution or elimination:

$$3x + 2y = 12$$

$$x - y = 4$$

Which method is more efficient here, and why?

- 6. Who was Rabbi Avraham bar Chiyya, and why is he considered a pioneer in Jewish mathematics?

  Discuss his authorship of Sefer ha-Mispar and how it made algebra accessible in Hebrew.
- 7. What was the Vilna Gaon's view on secular sciences like math and astronomy?

  Explain how he saw them as tools to enhance Torah learning and understanding of Hashem's creation.

## Chumash – Sample Subject Exam Questions

- 1. List the parshiyot (weekly Torah portions) of the book of Devarim.
- 2. To which book of the Torah does Parshat Ha'azinu belong? What is unique about the structure and message of this parsha?
- 3. Explain Rashi's (OBM)\* commentary on the word "בראשית" in the first pasuk of the Torah.
  - What issue is Rashi (OBM) addressing, and what lesson does he derive?
- 4. Compare the leadership of Yosef HaTzaddik (OBM) and Moshe Rabbeinu (OBM).
  - How did each respond to personal and national challenges, and what can we learn from their examples?
- On the pasuk "נעשה אדם בצלמנו כדמותנו" (Bereisheeth 1:26), how do Rashi (OBM) and Ramban (OBM) differ in their explanations? What issue is raised by the plural form, and how does each commentator address it?
- 6. How does the Torah present the concept of teshuvah Give an example from a character in Chumash who demonstrates sincere change.
- 7. Bilam came to curse Bnei Yisrael, but ended up blessing them. Choose one of his blessings and explain how its poetic structure and word choice reveal a deeper truth about the Jewish people.
